# Hot topic: Crime reporting

Police non-emergency reporting: 311

According to the Baltimore Police Department, citizens can self-report crimes under the following circumstances:

- The incident is not an emergency.
- There are no known suspects.
- There are no known witnesses.
- The crime is not in progress or has not occurred within the last 30 minutes.
- The incident occurred in Baltimore City.
- There is no evidence to collect. \*
- The incident is not a hate / bias crime.
- The incident did not occur on a state freeway.
- The incident is domestic related. \*
- There was no injury or threat of bodily harm

Highlights from 2023 legislative session:

- Privacy and access around reproductive health. There will be a ballot measure in Nov.
  2024 giving Marylanders the ability to enshrine right to reproductive care in the Maryland State Constitution
- Maryland Corps service year for young people

On the horizon:

- Study of red line project anticipating reports by November
- Baltimore Regional Water Task Force working on governance water around water & wastewater in the region to address challenges
- Thrive Academy wraparound approach for 150 juveniles who are most likely to offend

Questions:

- Are there measures to improve food and healthcare affordability?
  - Escalated minimum wage increase to \$15 an hour beginning January 1, 2024

- Expanded Earned Income Tax Credit
- o Single-cost healthcare has decreased healthcare costs in hospitals
- Investing in public transit?
  - Revenue is declining for Transportation Trust Fund; the Trust Fund is multi-modal, and prioritization of expenditures is key. A new Commission will present report on investing in transportation in 2025.
- Red line Who decides? What mode?
  - Agency decision; agencies apply to federal DOT
- Funding from marijuana and gambling?
  - More money than was expected is flowing in!
  - New licenses will be issued at the end of this year will be test of equitable access to market
  - Sports betting has been fractional compared with state budget
- Teacher shortage/Blueprint?
  - More acute in some parts of the state; school system in Baltimore City is working to fill teacher positions
